Dear Friends

I am busy reading an exciting story about love, war and the supernatural. No, I am not revisiting Miguel Cervantes's Don Quixote or Philip Pullman's enthralling book Northern Lights, rather I am pouring over the Easter Story as told by the gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. I can well understand why contemporary Britons insist on watching Eastenders, or Harry Hill's TV Burps. They are quirky and entertaining programmes. Yet to dismiss 'the greatest story ever told' as so much phooey is to turn one's back on a great cultural and spiritual experience.

Easter is with us again and the world's wicked sub-plot is manifestly unchanged since last April. Rivers of blood flow freely in Iraq and Afghanistan. Our brave soldiers are hard pressed on every side. In this month three years ago Iraqis were holding their first national day, which marked the anniversary of the fall of Saddam Hussein's grim regime in Baghdad. Today the same nation is fighting a civil war largely because there is no "strong man", no tyrant, like Saddam Hussein, or no rule of law to keep the warring factions apart. Other places, for example Libya, might well comply and meet the deadline for the destruction of their chemical weapons this month whilst Iran threatens to trash the fairytale and spoil the happy ending by increasing its stockpiles of nuclear weapons. The epic struggle between war and peace - Good and Evil - is, it appears, an incessant, infernal narrative.

In Christ, Christians believe they have a spiritual, supernatural presence, a King whose kingdom is not of this world but who holds sway and dominion in the hearts and minds of people of good will everywhere. King Jesus was both an innocent man and a superhuman, the Son of God, who was hung from a cross by violent men, and brought back to life by a loving Father. He died to save us all from both ourselves and from an angry chaotic world.

During April for the first time the Lulu Blooker Prize will be awarded to the best web-based blogs or websites. Christians agree the winning story was announced over two thousand years ago, long before the advent of the printing press, TV, computers or the worldwide web.
